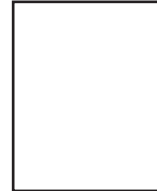

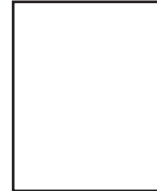

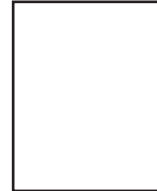

- Fee can be remitted from the above mentioned dates of each quarter (May, Aug, Nov & Feb) without late fee, Fees can be remitted with a late fee of Rs.100/- from 11th till end of the month. After this the student is liable for removal from the rolls
- The student will thereafter have to seek re-admission. Re-admission will be made subject to clearance of all dues including late fee. Re-admission fee Rs. 800./-.
- **All dues are to be cleared two weeks prior to half yearly (Term I) & Annual exam (Term II) to enable issue of Admit Cards.**
- **No student will be permitted to enter the examinations halls without Admit Cards.**
- Discount of Rs. 500/- will be applicable for payment of full year's fee during the first quarter on or before 25th May 2023.

SYSTEM OF FEE PAYMENT

Fees can be paid through any of the following methods :

1. Through branches of South Indian Bank Ltd, across India through Cash/ SIB Cheque, using the triplicate challan provided by the school. The remittance challan has to be filled up in all respects by the Students/Parents with full details as required by the institution. The Student's Copy of the challan has to be kept safely and produced at the school office, on demand, if necessary.
2. Using Virtual Account Number: Virtual Account Code(VAC) integrated for our account number at SIB, Fort Cochin Branch is A192A11. The Virtual Account Number (VAN) of student can be made by prefixing the Virtual Account Code to the Unique Identification Number like Roll Number. For example, if the student's roll number is 845, then the student's account number will be A192A11845. By using this account number and IFSC Code of the Branch, the student/parent can walk into any branch of the bank and make the NEFT to the School Account or else it is possible through the Internet Banking NEFT. Hence the School Account will be credited with the respective Roll Numbers and the school can identify the details of the fee payment.

NB: Any fee payment to the school account other than the Virtual Account number will be rejected and the school will not be liable for any loss.

- *3. Online Mode of payment using Debit/Credit cards or Internet Banking.
Parents can login to the ERP using the Link provided in our Website and can make the fee payments using the option provided in the login page using the internet banking. The fee payments of the respective quarter can be remitted. The facility will be available 24*7.

Application for TC should be submitted before 31st of March.

TC will be issued only if all dues have been cleared.

Parent deposits will be refunded on 30th of June and November. Application for the same along with the original receipt should be given in advance before 10th of June and November.

Admissions will be closed by the second week of April. In any other genuine cases prior permission from the Principal has to be taken.

Parents must ensure the proper maintenance of the receipts.

In order to have uniformity and to inculcate a feeling of equality all students are required to be in the prescribed school uniform while attending school, the school functions, various competitions and special classes.

Nationality, State, Community or Religion should not be the reason for any change in the uniform worn by the children. The school will function in the spirit of a secular institution

Note:

Shirt should be tucked in properly so that the school belt is visible.

Low waist Trousers, **pencil pants** Shorts and skirts are not permitted.

For girls, hair below shoulder level should be tied in two plaits and up to shoulder level in two ponytails.

Students should be in school uniform while taking photos for school purposes and attestation.

Students should be in school uniform in the school campus unless permitted to dress differently.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENT

The following acts and conduct on the part of students will amount to misconduct which will be severely dealt with

- Misbehaviour towards teachers or any other employee of the school.
- Leaving the school premises during school hours without prior permission of concerned teacher/Principal.
- Bullying others.
- Damaging school Property.
- Bringing unauthorized articles like mobile phones, CD'S, unapproved books, magazines, play things etc.
- Smoking.
- Use of drugs or intoxicants except on prescription by a registered medical practitioner.
- Use of violence in any form.
- Use of abusive language.
- Improper use of computer resources of the school amounting to display or access of unauthorized websites/software portraying indecent/pornographic material.
- Students are not allowed to use two wheelers.
- Malpractices during test/examinations.
- Flouting the rules and regulations of the school.
- Continued absence from classes without the permission of the teacher/Principal.
- Eve-teasing/misbehaviour towards girl students.
- Propagating a strike/disruption of classes.
- Involving in acts of moral turpitude.
- Casteism, Communalism or practice of untouchability.
- Carrying any kind of weapon in the school premises.
- **Misbehavior outside the school especially in school uniform will attract severe punishment.**

COMMENDATION CERTIFICATE WILL BE AWARDED FOR EXEMPLARY BEHAVIOUR AND CONDUCT

LEAVE RULES

- Leave will be granted only if applied for in writing by parents with reason.
- Name of the pupil will be struck off from the rolls if he/she is absent without permission for more than 15 days consecutively.
- Application for sick leave should be supported by a medical certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner.
- 80% attendance is compulsory. The pupil will not be allowed to appear for the annual examination incase he/she does not have the required percentage of attendance.
- A fitness certificate is essential for a student after prolonged illness.
- ***Leave has to be written in the specified page of the diary by the parent.***

FIRST AID AND MEDICAL RULES

The School shall do its best to prevent any form of accident or mishap to students in the school premises. However in any case of emergency

- Immediate First Aid will be provided from the school.
- The student concerned shall be sent to a medical centre and parent or guardian concerned shall be informed.
- In the event of any accident or mishap in the school or on the way to school or back home, the school does not accept any legal responsibility.
- **The school must be informed in writing if any special precautions are to be taken on medical grounds. In absence of such information on school records the school shall not be held responsible for any eventuality caused due to such problems.**
- Parents should not send their wards to school if they are suffering from a contagious or infectious disease.

LIBRARY RULES

- Books will be issued only in the concerned library period (two books only).
- Books to be returned within two weeks after the date of issue.
- If a book is lost by the borrower he/she will have to replace the book or pay a fine which is twice the cost of the book.
- Strict silence has to be maintained.
- Students are advised not to bring personal CDs to the School library.
- CDs will not be lent.

CAMPUS RULES

- No student should be in the campus without the prescribed uniform.
- No student should remain in the campus on working days after dispersal, unless asked to.
- On holidays students are not allowed in the school campus unless permitted by the school authorities.
- **Students called for any practice or special classes shall not stay beyond 5 pm unless permitted by the Principal.**
- School bags will be checked at any time to instill discipline in the school.

CLEANLINESS RULES

- Student should wear properly washed, ironed, neat uniform.
- Class rooms, toilets and school premises should be kept clean.
- Refrain from writing on tables and walls.
- Shoes worn should be polished and shining.
- All books should be covered and maintained neatly.
- Refrain from littering the campus.

GENERAL RULES

- No ornaments are allowed.
- Refrain from bringing unnecessary cash to the school.
- Use of mobile phones, cosmetics, CDs, iPod, Playthings, jewellery, expensive watches by the student is not permitted inside the school campus.
- Use of abusive language in school premises will be severely dealt with.
- Any student caught for any type of misdemeanor may be suspended from attending classes for a stipulated period. The Management reserves the right to decide such matters. Mal practices, communal remarks or any form of ragging, gundaism will lead to expulsion of the culprit from the roll of the school.
- Parents are requested to apply in the prescribed format for Transfer Certificate one month in advance.
- The Principal has the right to suspend the attendance or require the withdrawal of any pupil whose conduct is injurious to the tone of the school or whose progress is not satisfactory.
- Proper footwear preferably canvas shoes should be compulsorily worn when on the play field.
- Students are not allowed to go outside the class without the **class pass**.
- Changing of classrooms between periods should be done in Silence and in an orderly manner. Running in the Corridors is strictly prohibited .
- Lending and borrowing of money and other articles is not permitted.
- Student should always be polite and Courteous in their behaviour both inside and outside the school. They should remember that the school is judged by their conduct.
- They should always greet the teachers when they meet them. Bullying and use of foul language is a punishable offence .
- No student will be allowed to step out of the school gate without the gate pass signed by the class teacher or office superintendent .

EXAMINATION RULES

- A student will not be allowed to appear for the final examination if there is consistent irregularity in submitting assignments and projects or on account of misconduct.
- **Admit Cards will be issued to the students who have cleared their fees before the Half yearly & Annual Exam.**
- If a student is detained twice in the same standard, he/she shall have to be withdrawn from the school.

- Students with dyslexia may be advised to move over to Open Schooling system if their academic performance necessitates it.
- The School has a committee chaired by the Principal to ensure the implementation of the rules regarding promotion. The committee will take a decision regarding any case that is not covered by these rules and the committee's decision shall be final and abiding.
- A student securing higher than E Grade in all assessments in the consolidated result shall be promoted to the next standard.
- ***The paper attempted by a student stand cancelled if he/she is caught copying.***

GUIDELINES TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- Ensure that your ward is punctual, regular and disciplined.
- Drop your child at least 5 minutes before the first bell and avoid unnecessary rush and the resulting stress on your ward.
- It is desirable that parents visiting the school uphold the decorum of the institution by being well dressed.
- Every student should carry the school diary and ID card every day.
- Parents are requested to check the school diary regularly. Remarks made in the diary should be countersigned.
- Monitor your ward's home work and study schedule.
- Check the haircut, uniform and bag of your ward in the morning.
- Ensure that your ward has taken his breakfast before starting for school or ensure that he/she has packed food to eat at school during the breaks between classes or has got money to buy from the canteen.
- Ensure that your wards attend the assembly every day. Late comers may not be sent home but they are likely to lose attendance. Such loss of attendance will not be condoned. Volunteer school programmes, attend meetings and pay the fees timely.
- Encourage your wards to participate in all events and programmes and make use of the opportunities for their all-round development.
- Parents/Guardians or other persons are not allowed to see the students or meet the teachers during class hours. In case of an emergency, they can contact the office.
- Boxes, pencils, books, projects, lunch boxes etc will not be handed over to the ward during school hours as it hampers with the smooth functioning of the school.
- When a student falls sick or in case of an emergency the parent has to come to pick the child. Otherwise, an authorization letter has to be send by the parent.
- See that your ward carries text/note books according to the time table for a given day.
- Ensure that your ward fills in all details of topics for tests/exams/projects etc. in the appropriate pages of the diary.
- Avoid sending fancy and expensive pencil boxes, pencils, erasers, pens etc with your wards.
- **Private tuitions may leave your ward with less time for self-study. This should be avoided as far as possible.**
- In case your ward exhibit characteristics of a slow-learner, you have to obtain a certificate from a competent authority regarding the same. The certificate must be submitted to the school office.
- Encourage your ward to take a balanced interest in curricular and co-curricular activities.

- Pay attention to the language your ward uses in communication and ensure that they use good language always.
- Parents/Guardians should attend open house meetings without fail. You should also sign the profile, the corrected answer scripts, test papers promptly.
- Kindly inform the school office and the class teacher about any change of address or telephone/mobile number to contact in case of necessity/emergency and to receive messages send from the school.
- Railway concession forms can be obtained from the school office after furnishing the necessary details.
- Parents/Guardians should refrain from passing adverse criticism of the school & teachers in the presence of their wards.
- Parents/Guardians can send their feed backs/suggestions for improvement of the school activities in letters addressed to the Principal by providing complete details about themselves. Confidentiality of such letters will be strictly maintained.
- Every student must stay with his/her parents or a guardian who is nominated by the parents through a written application to the Principal and who has subsequently been approved in writing by the school authorities.
In case of damage of school properties entire cost of replacing will be levied.
- As a part of our physiological goal towards inculcating healthy habits, we would insist our students to carry steel lunch boxes and water bottles.
- Before parents / authorized guardian take the ward out of the school, the class teacher should be informed, which in turn will be intimated to the Principal.

A NOTE TO THE PARENTS

- The enrolment of the pupil to the School implies that the parents of the ward have agreed to abide by the Rules and Regulations of the school and those framed from time to time, in the best interest of the school and all its students.
- Whereas the School Management is committed to provide maximum possible assistance to suit the individual need of every student, at times it may not be practically feasible to make changes in policies, systems and procedures to suit the requirement of a specific student. Please be assured that such matters of concern will be looked into with due importance and a decision will be taken in the best interest of all the students and the school.
- The decision of the Principal shall be final in matters related to the school including those related to disciplinary action for violation of school rules. **THE MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO MODIFY OR CHANGE THE RULES AND REGULATIONS AS AND WHEN FOUND REQUIRED AND THE MANAGEMENT'S DECISION WILL BE FINAL.**
- **The Management reserves the right to increase the fees to defray increase in cost.**
- **On birthdays students of classes 1 to 5 can come in colour dresses & can distribute anyone stationary items (like pencil, eraser, sharpner). No fancy items or toffies are allowed.**

ATTENDANCE

1. Regular attendance of the school is most essential. The minimum requirement of attendance in the academic year is 80% for all classes.
2. All students' are expected to attend school on the reopening day after any vacation, unless applied for granted leave for extended period.
3. Leave of absence is given to students on prior application from the parents. In unavoidable circumstances, the absence has to be regularized on the day of rejoining the school with a valid leave note from the parent.
4. Students suffering from any communicable diseases must re-join only with a certificate of fitness, after due period of quarantine.
5. Absence without leave for more than seven days is liable to result in the name of the student getting struck off the rolls. Re-Admission in such cases entails payment of all dues and fresh admission fees.
6. **PERFECT ATTENDANCE CARD WILL BE AWARDED FOR CENT PERCENT ATTENDANCE ON SELECTED MONTHS.**

USE OF UNFAIR MEANS

All students are expected to maintain highest standard of honesty in academic and in all other aspects of school life. Use of unfair means in test or homework is considered as a serious offence.

HEALTH AND HYGIENE RULES

1. Students are advised to take bath every morning.
2. Nails and Hair to be trimmed regularly. (Haircut compulsory for boys)
3. Girls to plait their long hair. Hair should be free from lice.
4. Students should come to school in neat uniform with clean socks and well polished shoes.
5. Hands to be washed before and after eating. A habit of bringing clean water bottles and napkins to be developed.
